



A SEAL! WHAT SHOULD YOU DO?



Usually, seals avoid people and go into the water when humans come close. However, occasionally a seal will stay on the beach in a busy area, perhaps even where you are walking. Quite a rare sight! A seal staying put doesn't necessarily mean it is sick; often, seals are just resting on the beach for a while. They can rest at the same spot for up to two days!





WHAT ARE NORMAL SITUATIONS?



Is the seal already **marked with a color**? This means the seal is in observation. The condition of the animal is being watched by our seal guards.



Is the seal lying with its head and tail up, in a **banana pose**? Or on its side? Then this is completely normal. These are positions that healthy seals lie in when they are resting.



The seal is lying **alone**, perhaps it is even a pup. This is not a reason to panic; seals are solitary animals and often lie alone. The mother can leave her pup alone for longer than 8 hours to go hunting!
